#### DISTINCTIVES

- **Socratic Seminar:** Students work collectively to find answers through the art of asking probing and insightful questions.
- Logic & Rhetoric: Students take full-year classes in formal logic and formal rhetoric.
- Classical Languages: Latin is required for all students.
- Senior Thesis: Regents's capstone project is the senior thesis. Students formulate a topic and question and direct their own research in order to write a 15-20 page position paper, give a 15-20 minute speech based on the paper, and respond to cross-examination questions.
- **Public oration:** Students research and present multiple speeches exceeding 10 minutes to public audiences.
- Scholarly writing is emphasized across the curriculum.

#### **AWARDS**

- Subject awards are given annually to the one student in each class who earns the highest grade.
- The *Coram Deo* award is awarded to the one student each year who has best demonstrated excellence in all things at Regents, especially servant leadership and a love of learning.
