Due to small class sizes, Regents does not rank students.

All classes are taught at the honors level. Because of this, our average grade is lower than in most schools with comparable demographics. Because of the difficulty of coursework, many students who enter Regents in middle or high school repeat a grade.

Regents does not offer AP, IB or dual-enrollment courses.

DISTINCTIVES

- **Socratic Seminar:** Students work collectively to find answers through the art of asking probing and insightful questions.
- **Logic & Rhetoric:** Students take full-year classes in formal logic and formal rhetoric.
- **Classical Languages:** Latin is required for all students.
- **Senior Thesis:** Regents's capstone project is the senior thesis. Students formulate a topic and question and direct their own research in order to write a 15-20 page position paper, give a 15-20 minute speech based on the paper, and respond to cross-examination questions.
- **Public Orator:** Students research and present multiple speeches exceeding 10 minutes to public audiences.
- **Scholarly Writing** is emphasized across the curriculum.

AWARDS

- Subject awards are given annually to the one student in each class who earns the highest grade.
- The *Coram Deo* award is awarded to the one high school student each year who has best demonstrated character and servant leadership at Regents.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP
